

Teen SENSE is a multidisciplinary initiative that works to secure the right of youth in state custody to comprehensive, LGBTQ-inclusive sexual health care and sexual health literacy programs. This includes ensuring that staff of foster care, detention, and other governmentoperated and -regulated youth facilities are equipped to understand and protect all youth in their care, regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression. The **Youth Advocacy Corps**, a related initiative of Teen SENSE, provides an opportunity for young people from across the country to develop competence and real-world experience in sexual health advocacy. Through the Youth Advocacy Corps, young people learn about issues related to sexual health and the law, and develop the skills necessary to become effective advocates through contact with policymakers at the local, state and federal level.
