Dear Congresswoman/man XX,

We the undersigned would like to express our deep concern with the Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) decision to remove a website, hosted by the Department's Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMSHA), that sought to provide basic preventative health information to lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) individuals. As a member of the Energy and Commerce Committee, you have direct oversight of SAMSHA's work and, in this capacity, we urge you to stop this censorship of vital preventative health information.

For years, SAMHSA made available website content that focused on providing basic yet critical resources to educators, health professionals, and gay and lesbian Americans. The website covered educational information on topics such as substance abuse, youth suicide, ethnic and cultural diversity, social support, violence prevention, and homophobia. However, in January 2006, just eleven days after the Family Research Council (FRC) launched an attack on the website, SAMHSA completely removed the information and took down the website without explanation. Apparently, in order to appease a small group of anti-gay forces, HHS decided to suppress a vast amount of simple, medically accurate, preventative health information that addressed the needs of lesbian and gay Americans, their families, and their healthcare providers.

SAMHSA's stated mission is to "build resilience and facilitate recovery for people with or at risk for substance abuse and mental illness." Its vision is "a life in the community for *everyone*," (emphasis added). Regrettably, HHS already has a history of insensitivity towards preventative health needs of the LGBT community. For example, its <a href="www.4parents.gov">www.4parents.gov</a> website originally provided no advice to parents of teens questioning their sexuality except to see "a family therapist who shares your values," and continues to use biased language such as calling gay and lesbian individuals members of a "lifestyle." The decision by HHS to remove the SAMHSA website is yet another affront to the lesbian and gay population and the healthcare providers that serve them.

We respectfully seek an explanation from HHS regarding the rationale behind the decision to take down the website. More importantly, we seek the restoration of the website as soon as possible, and a commitment to medically accurate, preventative health information for LGBT Americans. We sincerely urge you to join Congresswoman Tammy Baldwin in her letter requesting that HHS stop censoring this important health information.
